ASTHMA FIRST AID

Blue/Grey Reliever

Airomir, Asmol, Ventolin or Zempreon and Bricanyl

Blue/grey reliever medication is unlikely to harm, even if the person does not have asthma



DIAL TRIPLE ZERO (000) FOR AN AMBULANCE IMMEDIATELY IF THE PERSON:

- is not breathing
- suddenly becomes worse or is not improving
- is having an asthma attack and a reliever is not available
- is unsure if it is asthma
- is known to have anaphylaxis. ALWAYS GIVE ADRENALINE AUTOINJECTOR FIRST, and then Reliever even if there are no skin symptoms





SIT THE PERSON UPRIGHT

- Be calm and reassuring
- Do not leave them alone

GIVE 4 SEPARATE PUFFS OF RELIEVER PUFFER

- Shake puffer
- Put 1 puff into spacer
- Take 4 breaths from spacer
 - Repeat until 4 puffs have been taken



If using **Bricanyl**, give 2 separate inhalations (5 years or older)

WAIT 4
MINUTES

If breathing does not return to normal, give
 4 more separate puffs of reliever as above



Bricanyl: Give 1 more inhalation

IF BREATHING DOES NOT RETURN TO NORMAL





DIAL TRIPLE ZERO (000)

- Say 'ambulance' and that someone is having an asthma attack
- Keep giving <u>4 separate puffs every</u>
 <u>4 minutes</u> until emergency assistance arrives



Bricanyl: Give 1 more inhalation every 4 minutes until emergency assistance arrives
